I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. DESCRIPTION

1. Project Location:

A greenwaste composting facility (as authorized by Conditional Use Permit 27, Map 143) is currently operating on the project site. The property consists of portions of three parcels totaling approximately 230 acres. Currently, there is approximately 188 acres of the project site (existing site boundaries) designated 8.1 (Intensive Agriculture) by the Kern County General Plan, and the proposed expansion area (approximately 43 acres) is designated 8.3 (Extensive Agriculture) by the Kern County General Plan. The existing project site boundaries and proposed expansion area are zoned A (Exclusive Agricultural) by the Kern County Zoning Ordinance.

2. Project Request:

The project includes a request for land use entitlements necessary to allow for operation of greenwaste composting facility as modified. Implementation of the project as requested would require an Amendment to the Kern County General Plan from 8.1 (Intensive Agriculture) to 8.3 (Extensive Agriculture). Additionally, implementation of the project as requested would require a modification of Conditional Use Permit 27, Map 143 (Resolution 72-93; approved July 8, 1993; modified on March 11, 1999, and May 25, 2000) to allow for: 1) installing an aeration system; 2) expanding the amount and source of food waste accepted; 3) accepting digestates and biosolids; 4) removing the feedstock tonnage limits and replacing it with an overall tonnage limit; 5) expanding the CUP boundary; 6) allowing sorting and grinding of an estimated 10% of feedstock; 7) allowing wood mulching and coloring; and, 8) increasing the limit of outgoing trucks to 150 trucks per day

B. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONSULTANT

The consultant will be expected to prepare one Project Level EIR for the proposed project. Included in this work product is the, assistance with NOP maps, distribution of NOP, Draft EIR mitigation outline, Draft EIR, Response to Comments, Mitigation Monitoring Program, and mandatory California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) findings of fact. The County's format for preparation of the EIR will be provided to the consultant by the Planning and Community Development Department.

The County's Thresholds of Significance related to air quality, traffic, and hazards/health risks/vectors, as well as the criteria in the adopted Kern County Environmental Checklist Form, are to be used in assessing the significance of project-level and cumulative level environmental effects (see Kern County Initial Study checklist which includes the Kern County Thresholds of Significance attached).

When preparing a proposal for submittal to Kern County, the following factors should be addressed including work products and payment milestones:

 - i. Notice of Preparation (NOP) Kern County staff will write and prepare the NOP, including a project description, list of probable environmental effects, etc. of the project.
